THE PLAN

WHAT YOU NEED

BIBLE STUDY METHOD

- Observation | What does it say?
 (Interrogate the text: who, what, when, where, and how.)
- Interpretation | What did it mean to the intended audience?
- Application | What did I learn that should affect my life?
 (Is there a behavior, attitude, or understanding that should change in my life?)

GOALS (Each is valuable independently, but all three combined will provide the greatest result.)

- Read (hopefully more than once).
- Mark (strategically looking for details that matter).
- Record (lists and labels—themes, places, teaching, prophecies, etc.).

Following A Different Way

As we have seen already in 1 and 2 Corinthians, there are those who try to discredit Paul. They challenge his calling and credentials and try to pollute the Gospel. In Galatians, Paul is sharing details of his special calling and clarifying the simplicity of the Gospel. He is challenging those who have been confused and taken in by false teaching to consider the ramifications of accepting this "other gospel."
